WE DID IT!!!! Our new building at Alakara Home is up and running. A large new dining room, a library and a sick bay are downstairs and some guest rooms, office and bathrooms upstairs. We are so grateful to Grace Vineyard of Christchurch who gifted the money for this build. Our old dining room becomes a 2nd dormitory to enable us to take more girl orphans into our home. I have spent the last 6 ½ months in Moroto managing this build. It's been a miracle!! We have called



the building "grace" in honour of Grace Vineyard, and also as it is a sign of God's grace to Project Moroto and in the lives of the girls of Alakara Home.



This year we have also taken in 4 new girls aged 7-9. Here is Vicki arriving at Alakara – her grandmother had died and she had been roaming the streets by herself for a month with no food. But look at her now!! Several months on she is happy, healthy, and a lot heavier!! The sunken eyes have been replaced with a big wide smile!



Here are Vicki, Magdalena & Goretty who came to Alakara in May. They are so grateful to be in Alakara Home and have changed significantly by being here – not just in health but also in joy and hope for a future. Vicki and Magdalena are class prefects in their P1 classes and Goretty is in P3. Magdalena wants to be the "boss of all bosses"!!! I won't be surprised!!!



We baptized 13 of our girls in a mountain stream with water below knee level so there was a lot of heavy lifting going on as 5 of our girls are now taller than me!! They all made their own genuine decision to do this. Of course a whole lot of splashing and playing in the water ensued!!



My Boasting Corner!!!

The girls continue their generosity by fasting one meal a month to take food to the poor grandmothers in the village next door. They also continue "ALAKARA CONSTRUCTION" by building their 3rd hut for a grandfather whose hut was falling down. They also now fund a feeding programme one Saturday a month which they used to benefit from before coming to Alakara!! All this they do from the funds we raise by selling the bracelets that they make.



Future Plans:

We are launching Nakapelimen Education Programme (NEP) and will be funding primary education for 20 poor children for 7 years starting Feb 2019. It is a small step to stop the poverty cycle in the village next door to us.



The girls are asking God for me to build a high school in Moroto!!! I am **VERY** afraid!!!! Especially when the local MP says Alakara Home is the best project in Moroto and



offers us 10 acres!!! Any teachers, education experts ??? **HELP!** I might need you!!!

How to help:
