I am off to Moroto again on the 2nd of May to build a new building at Alakara Home!!!! We are very excited about this as it will allow us to take more girls year by year with a maximum up to 40. Alakara is the girls' home and they will not be asked to leave until they wish to so we need to ensure we have the beds and space we need and that our facilities are being fully utilized. There will even be a couple of guest rooms if you want to come and stay on site!!!

We are also putting in a solar pump for our bore hole, and installing a 5000ltr tank and irrigation piping system to water our large vege garden, and also provide all the water that Alakara will need. Who would have thought I'd get excited about irrigation!!!

I will be in Moroto for 6 months and hope to have our new building all completed in that time. I am blessed to have 3 visitors in the first 3 weeks: John - an engineer who will be fantastic re installing pumps, and confirming building foundations and plans; Bridget - a pastor from Christchurch who is back for her 3rd visit!!; and Karina - a mother of 3 girls who will be a jack of all trades!!! We also have a couple arriving early June for a weekend to see what we do. So it will be lovely to have some kiwi accents around. The girls will be home from school for their holidays in May so that will be great to have them home.

All my time will be overseeing the building process (I might bang a nail in here and there and lay a brick or two!!), the solar pump and irrigation installation, caring for and spending time with the girls, and also checking out other possible ways we can help in Moroto - maybe repainting the poor school over the road from us for a start!!
